I wanted to take this opportunity to provide you with an update on the progress we've made so far, thanks to your generosity. But first, I would like to take a moment to reflect on the beauty of the season and the hope it brings. Just as spring is a time of renewal, our organisation has experienced positive changes that we are excited to share with you.

In March I had the opportunity to visit our projects and partners in Kosovo and to see the impact of 25 years of collaboration first hand. One of the youngest countries in the world, Kosovo recently celebrated their 17th anniversary of independence. The stories of resilience and hope that I heard from the people there were truly inspiring. It was heart-warming to see offspring of Irish dairy cows in communities that received the original animals 20 years ago and to observe and hear about the difference our mission has made to many lives across the country. Seeing Bóthar cows that arrived last December producing 20 litres of milk in a first lactation underlines the immediate and noteworthy impact an Irish animal can have. We even had the opportunity to taste Bóthar cheese, a delicious reminder of the positive change we are making as we moved from village to village.

It is through your support and that of many Irish families, that this has been possible, for which we as an organisation are deeply grateful. As Kosovo marks 25 years since the start of the war, it is our intention to gift 60 in-calf heifers to Kosovan families this Autumn. This gift will make a real difference in the lives of the people there, and we are thrilled to be able to continue our work with your support.

Bóthar Corporate Governance

As a charity, we understand the importance of trust and transparency in our operations. That's why we've made a promise to our supporters to build a fully transparent organisation, with robust governance and financial controls. We are proud to report that we are fulfilling that promise, with the establishment of a new Bóthar Board and the implementation of rigorous financial controls and accountability measures throughout our charity. Our recently published accounts, which can be viewed on our website, demonstrate our commitment to transparency and ethical behaviour. We are currently undergoing our next audit to ensure that we are adhering to the highest standards.

In our efforts to cut costs, we have decided to sell our Limerick office, which is now too large for our needs. This decision was not taken lightly, but we are confident that it will enable us to better focus

After the fraud perpetrated against the charity was discovered the previous board made the decision to halt active fundraising until the issue was resolved and the organisation was in a position to effectively monitor and manage income. As mentioned above we have made substantial changes to our procedures and our governance and the new board believe we are in a position to recommence active fundraising. We will be reaching out to all our supporters over the coming months with more details on the specific projects we are working on and ways to support the work. While Covid and recent inflation have had an impact here in Ireland, that impact has in many ways been much more pronounced in developing countries and our work is as important as ever in helping the communities where we work.

As a valued Bóthar supporter, your feedback and suggestions are crucial in helping us to continue to improve and grow as an organization and we encourage you to reach out if you have any comments, suggestions or questions on the charity and its work. Your continued generosity and support enable us to make a meaningful and enduring contribution to communities worldwide.
